BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG ORDINANCE NO. 24/03

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS 2024 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS BY AND IN THE BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$7,429,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,379,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements or purposes to be undertaken by the Borough of Watchung, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the said improvements or purposes stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the aggregate sum of \$7,429,000, which sum includes \$2,050,000 as the aggregate amount of down payments for said improvements or purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). Said down payments are now available therefor by virtue of appropriations in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the part of said \$7,429,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$5,379,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said

improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$5,379,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (b) All such improvements or purposes set forth in Section 3(a) shall include, but are not limited to, as applicable, all engineering, architectural and design work, title searches, surveying, construction planning, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, construction inspection and contract administration, and also shall include all work, materials, equipment, accessories, labor and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto.
- (c) The aggregate estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purposes is \$5,379,000.
- (d) The estimated cost of said improvement or purpose is \$7,429,000, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, being the amount of \$2,050,000, as the down payment for said improvement or purpose.

SECTION 4. In the event the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Somerset and/or a private entity make a contribution or grant in aid to the Borough for the improvements and purposes authorized hereby and the same shall be received by the Borough prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then the amount of such bonds or notes to be issued shall be reduced by the amount so received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Somerset and/or a private entity. In the event, however, that any amount so contributed or granted by the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Somerset and/or a private entity shall be received by the Borough after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds or notes so issued and shall be used for no other purpose. This Section 4 shall not apply, however, with respect to any contribution or grant

in aid received by the Borough as a result of using funds from this bond ordinance as "matching local funds" to receive such contribution or grant in aid.

SECTION 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time in determinations. accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The Capital Budget or Budgets of the Borough are hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency, a resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital

Budget or Budgets and capital programs as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs will be on file in the office of the Clerk and will be available for public inspection.

SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are improvements which the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said improvements or purposes within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 14.78 years.
- has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$5,379,000 and the said bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$1,350,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements hereinbefore described.

SECTION 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance. The bonds or notes shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the bonds or notes and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 9. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue the bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 9 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

SECTION 10. The Borough Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Borough Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough

fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 11. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Code of the interest on all bonds and notes issued under this ordinance.

SECTION 12. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption and approval by the Mayor, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

("New Jersey-American Water" or "Company") filed with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board"), pursuant to N.J.S.A. \$8 48:2-21, 18-2-21.1, N.J.A.C. § 14:1-5.12, and such statutes, regulations and Board Orders that may be deemed by the Board to be applicable, for approval to recover regulatory assets which have been deferred for recovery pursuant to the Board's July 2, 2020 Order Establishing COVID-19 Regulatory Asset and December 21, 2022 Order Denying, in part, PSEAG's Motion to Extend the COVID Deferral Period in Docket No. AO20060471. On June 21, 2023, the Company filed an amended and restated petition to comply with the mandatory filing requirements established by the Board by Order dated June 7, 2023, in Docket No. AO20060471 ("Amended and Restated Petition"). The Amended and Restated Petition also requests the establishment of an uncollectible adjustment clause to recover or credit future bad debt agosts.

The proposed rates would increase annual revenues by \$5,406,028 or 0.56% for a period of three (3) years. The proposed changes in rates provide no profits to the Company. The proposed Special Program Charge ("SPC") permits the recovery of the Company's COVID-19 incremental costs incurred during the pandemic and Board's approved deferral period.

New Jersey-American Water's Amended and Restated Petition seeks to recover the total net amount of the COVID-19 costs incurred from March of 2020 through February of 2023. As

proposed, the total amount to be recovered through the SPC will apply to customer's bills monthly over the next three (3) years starting on the effective date of Board approval.

The proposed monthly surcharge rate to be collected from all water customers, including private and public fire, and all eligible wastewater customers through a volumetric charge for General Metered Service ("GMS") customers is \$0.0673 per thousand gallons and a fixed percustomer charge for non-GMS customers of \$1.23, which will be reconciled annually. The average GMS customer using 5,520 gallons per month will see their bill increase by \$0.37 per month and an average non-GMS customer will see their bill increase by \$1.23 per month). The monthly SPC will be applicable to the following rate schedules: GMS Rate Schedules A-1 through A-18; Rate Schedules C and D – Commodity Demand; Rate Schedule F – OW; Rate Schedules E, H, I, J; Rate Schedule G - SOS; Rate Schedules Lalumough L-13 — Private Fire Service; Rate Schedules M-1 through M-12 — Public Fire Service and Rate Schedules 1-A through 19-A — Wastewater Service (collectively "non GMS")

Any relief determined by the Board of Public Utilities to be just and reasonable may be applied by the Board in such a manner as it may deem appropriate.

FIELD AND FACILITY PERMIT APPLICATION USE POLICIES AND LEASE AGREEMENT

General Information

To rent a facility or field, community organizations are required to complete a rental application and pay the appropriate fee (if applicable). No "Sub-leasing" of any kind from one sports group to another is permitted. All dates, times and fields must be approved by the Borough.

The Borough reserves the right to consider all rental requests and allocate rental time based on the number of requests and overall time requested. The Borough reserves the right to disapprove permits if it is determined that fields are deteriorating because of overuse.

Community members must be 21 years of age to sign a field use agreement or rent a field or facility. All applicants are required to provide one adult chaperone for each group of 10 youth in attendance under the age of 21 for all planned activities.

The Borough reserves the right to require the renter to provide police security, porta-johns and other requirements, as the specific situation may dictate.

All fees are to be paid in full two weeks prior to an approval unless other arrangements have been made with the Recreation Coordinator.

The Borough reserves the right to cancel practices/games due to weather conditions and/or field conditions.

Failure to abide by this policy can result in cancellation of your rental agreement.

Renter Responsibilities

Applicants requesting use of Watchung fields or facilities must observe the following guidelines and requirements:

- 1. The renter must leave the area, facility or equipment in a clean and orderly condition. All trash must be properly disposed.
- 2. Prohibited Items: Beer, wine, alcoholic beverages, firearms, tobacco and illegal drugs.
- 3. **Liability:** The Watchung Recreation Commission and the Borough of Watchung assume no liability for the renter's use of the equipment, field or facility. The applicant shall hold the Borough harmless from any claim or liability arising out of any activity or conduct of the renter while using the equipment, field or facility in question. Applicants are required to supply general liability insurance that covers the Borough with limits of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit with an aggregate of \$2,000,000.00. A certificate of insurance, must be filed with the Borough at least 5 (five) days prior to the use of the Boroughs field or facility.
- 4. **Governmental Boards and Agencies:** Facilities are available at no charge to official government boards and agencies for events in the public interest when not otherwise in conflict with this policy.

Damages/Security: An additional security deposit may be required for certain types of activities for the purpose of additional cleaning, security, and/or other costs of the Borough caused by the use. Any and all damages to the facilities, equipment, and other Borough property, while being used by the renter, will be the responsibility of the renter and payable in full to the Borough of Watchung. Payment will include the costs of all labor, materials, and supplies to repair or replace the damage to facilities. The Recreation Commission reserves the right to decline renting to patrons who have incurred damages to Borough property in previous rentals.
- 6. Policy of Non-Discrimination: The Borough of Watchung facilities are available on a non-discriminatory basis. Appropriate activities need to accommodate individuals regardless of age, sex, race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disabilities, or marital status. The Borough of Watchung does not discriminate based on disability in admission access, treatment or employment in its programs or activities.
- 7. ADA Statement: Although specific programs for persons with disabilities are limited, the Borough of Watchung is committed to providing equal access to programs and facilities for these individuals. Reasonable accommodation and support can be requested to provide access to desired programs and activities. Requests should be made at least 10 (ten) days in advance. In addition, where a need is demonstrated and resources are available every reasonable effort will be made to establish specific programs for persons with disabilities.

LIGHTNING PREDICTION SYSTEM (THORGUARDIAN)

APPLICABLE FOR PHILLIPS FIELD ONLY

The Borough of Watchung has an automatic lightning prediction and warning system in continuous use referred to as the Thorguardian. This unit is located at the top of the Snack Shack at Phillip's field. The sensor monitors energy as far as 15 miles and evaluates the potential for lightning within an area of approximately 2 miles in radius. When the unit senses a hazardous condition, the system automatically provides both audible and visual alerts. When a dangerous condition exists a warning blast will occur and the amber light will flash.

THE FIELDS MUST BE CLEARED IMMEDIATELY WHEN THE SOUND ALARMS

The light will continue to flash until the dangerous condition to longer exists.

Please review the following safety points with your organization leaders and participant:

- 1. Do Not seek shelter under a tree
- 2. Do Not seek shelter on the snack shack deck
- 3. Do Not seek shelter in a dugout by a metal fence

The Thorguardian prediction system is only a supplementary source of guidance. Should thunderstorm conditions develop, and the system is not activated use good judgment and seek shelter.

AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED)

The Borough of Watchung has an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) on site at Phillips Field.

The AED is located on the south side of the snack shack at Phillips Field Sports Complex.

The Borough of Watchung and the Watchung Recreation Commission recommends that the use of the AED be administered by a certified individual.

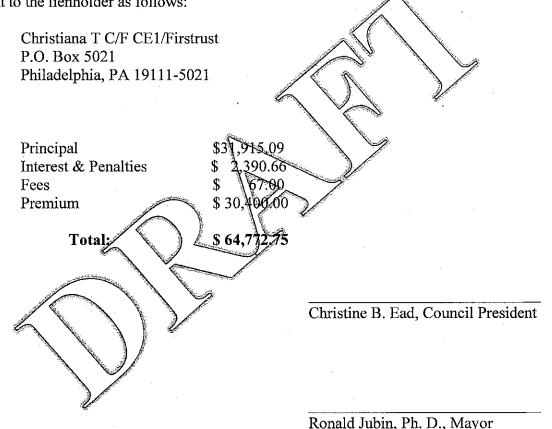

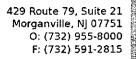

Scope of Service and Cost Proposal for the Borough of Watching Library Additions

Dear Mr. Damato:

REMINGTON & VERNICK ENGINEERS (RVE) is pleased to provide the following scope of services and associated cost proposal for test pits, geotechnical investigation, and evil / site design, for the proposed construction of multiple additions to the existing library at 12 Stirling Road in the Borough.

Our office is in receipt of conceptual plans for the library that have been prepared by Potter Architects (PA). It is our understanding that PA has been contracted by the Borough to perform architectural design services for the proposed library additions.

Working in tandem with PA, Remington & Vernick Engineers will provide the above referenced professional services utilizing the following three (3) phased approach (described below):

PHASE I: TEST PLT-INVESTIGATION SERVICES

This phase of the project will consist of the test pit investigation at the locations and depths requested by the architect.

RVE personnel will subcontract and perform the excavation of test pits TP-1, TP-2 and TP-3 using a minitracked excavator, including shoring of TP-1 as needed. The existing concrete and asphalt pavement will be saw cut to permit the excavation to expose the existing foundation. The foundation type and depth to the bottom of the foundation will be observed and recorded with photos, field dimensions and sketches and the foundation bearing material will be noted. The test pit will be backfilled with the excavated material and the removed concrete and asphalt pavement will remain on site adjacent to the test pit. Test pit TP-1 shall be properly shored or protected to allow RVE personnel, if necessary to enter the excavation to observe the foundation type and depth to the bottom of the foundation and recorded the foundation with photos, field dimensions and sketches and note the foundation bearing material. A single percolation test will also be performed.

Upon completion of the field investigation, RVE will prepare a geotechnical investigation letter report presenting our findings with photos and sketches.

We have assumed that Subcontractor personnel will not require New Jersey prevailing wage rates. It is understood that the site will be accessible to a mini-tracked excavator, that the right-of-entry exists, and that all available underground utility information will be provided prior to mobilization. Prior to test pit excavation, the excavation subcontractor will call in for the buried utility mark out, as required by NJ State law (NJ-One Call system).

Representatives from Remington & Vernick Engineers and the drilling subcontractor will also meet with representatives of the Library and/or Watchung Borough to review the location of the borings, as well as obtain the location of any buried utilities not marked out prior to the drilling operations. It is assumed information will be provided to us to allow for the layout of the test boring in the field from existing permanent features.

PHASE II: GEOTECHNICAL INVESTIGATION SERVICES

A review of available geological information for the site show the site is underlain by a thin mantel of glacial ground moraine consisting of silty sands and sandy silts further underlain by basalt bedrock. Therefore, it is anticipated bedrock could be encountered at a depth less than 30 feet below the existing ground surface. This geological information was obtained from the Rutgers Engineering Soil Survey of New Jersey, Report Number 7, Somerset County.

Based on a review of the limited information provided, we propose the subsurface investigation will consist of three (3) standard penetration test (SPT), drilled to a maximum depth of 30 to 40 feet below existing grade, or to "refusal," whichever occurs first. Normal sampling in the soil overburden in the test borings will be done in accordance with ASTM D 1586 and ar intervals of 2 ft for the first 12 ft and at 5 ft intervals thereafter with a 2-inch O.D. split-spoon sampler. Intact, "andisturbed" samples of any soft or cohesive strata using a 3-inch O.D. thin walled tube sampler have been excluded. If refusal is encountered prior to the termination depth of the borings. Observations for water level will be made during drilling and after completion of the borings; however, we have excluded the use of water observations pipes. Additionally, a water source will need to be provided near the site of the test borings in order to facilitate any rock coring operation as may be required.

Upon completion of the field investigation, we will conduct the necessary laboratory tests on the recovered samples, evaluate the engineering characteristics of the soils encountered, carry out geotechnical engineering analyses, and prepare a geotechnical engineering letter report presenting our findings.

We have assumed that this work will not require New Jersey prevailing wage rates or union labor and will be done using Level D PPE. It is understood that the site will be accessible to a track mounted drill rig, that the right-of-entry exists, and that all available underground utility information will be provided prior to mobilization. Prior to drilling, the drilling subcontractor will call in for the buried utility mark out, as required by NJ State law (NJ-One Call system). 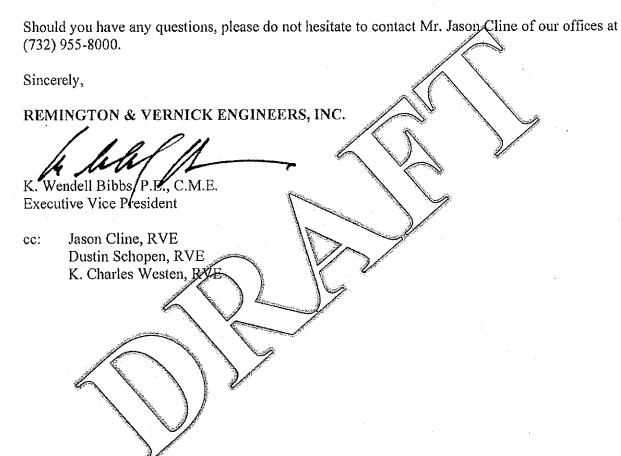

Project Monitoring Services during the Removal of Asbestos Containing Materials from the Watchung Public Library; 12 Stirling Road, Watchung, NJ 07069

Dear Mr. Damato,

Westchester Environmental appreciates the opportunity to present this proposal for a limited Asbestos Safety Control Monitoring (ASCM) services during the removal of Asbestos Containing Materials in the Library building.

The Borough is required by law to hire an anthorized Asbestos Safety Control Monitor (ASCM) that is separate from the asbestos abatement contractor. An Asbestos Safety Technician (AST) from the ASCM firm must be present during all NJ Subchapter 8 abatement work.

Air monitoring and project supervision are required to ensure contractor compliance with the abatement specifications as well as Federal, State and Local regulations. All Asbestos Safety Control Monitoring services shall be conducted by a certified Asbestos Safety Technician experienced in project monitoring. The AST will keep a continual check on the performance of the abatement contractor. All air samples will be taken and analyzed in accordance with federal and state guidelines. Phase Contrast Microscopy (PCM) samples are required during abatement to monitor asbestos contaminant concentrations on a daily basis. TEM air samples are required for final clearance. Air samples will be analyzed by fully accredited laboratories.

There are a number of variables many of which are determined by the abatement contractor. New Jersey Subchapter 8, regulations governing the removal of asbestos in public buildings along with the contractor's plan of action will determine the final air monitoring costs. Estimated costs for the work are provided below. The job is expected to take 15 working regular weekdays to complete with the building unoccupied. The Borough of Watchung will only be charged for work actually performed.
