

**Watchung Historical Committee
Minutes of the July 24th, 2024 Meeting**

Attendance: Chris Vander Fliet, Tim Logan, Don Monetti, Maureen Greenbaum, Stephen Pote, John Guzman, Karen Jubin, Michael DeParto, Keli Leunes, Emily White, Mayor Ron Jubin.

Absent: Bob Mayers, and Paul Fischer (Council Liaison).

The Meeting was called to order at 7:02 PM. Members of the meeting were present for a quorum. Minutes of the June 19th meeting were discussed. Motion to approve the minutes from the June 19th meeting was made by Chris Vander Fliet and seconded by Tim Logan. Minutes approved.

CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT – C. Vander Fliet

Vander Fliet provided a reminder to all members that the Weekend Journey in the Past will be October 12th and 13th. Please keep the weekend open to attend and assist with this event.

Vander Fliet thanked Maureen Greenbaum for her continued work (and continued progress!) on the website.

Vander Fliet reported that the walkway and steps in front of the Texier House were recently removed and replaced by the Borough. If you have not gone outside to see then, please do! The new structures look great!

Additional T-shirts were ordered in size XL and XXL. More are needed for the Harvest Festival in October.

Vander Fliet recommended that everyone please leave a review of the Texier House Museum on Facebook, Google, Trip Advisor, or Yelp. An email was sent by Maureen to complete this. It is quick and easy!

Vander Fliet thanked everyone who attended the Community Scanning Day on July 8th. It was very successful and well attended! Another scanning day is scheduled for September 15th.

Sue Tucker Recognition – Maureen Greenbaum started a draft document asking for the Borough to name Sue Tucker the official Watchung Historian as part of Watchung's 100th Anniversary. It also asked that she be honored as an Emeritus Member. The document was sent around for the committee's review and Vander Fliet asked those who stand behind the letter to add their name below. The final document will be sent to the Borough for their review (See attachments).

VICE CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Tim stated that he would assist Thomas (Eagle Scout candidate) and Sue on the Eagle Scout project. An adult needs to be present when Thomas is present. Tim is working on gathering Ness Property artifacts.

LIAISON REPORT – P. Fischer

Mayor Ron Jubin was present on behalf of Paul Fisher.

BiLaws:

Mayor Jubin said that instead of the bi-laws for Historical, the part of the ordinance dealing with Historical needs to be amended. Mayor Jubin said that possibly the ordinance should reflect emeritus status for Sue, as well as any other changes for the Council to vote on.

Key Fobs/Door Lock/Cameras:

It was discussed that the Key Fobs (now working) should be used by Committee members. Additionally, a change of the code on the existing keypad may provide a second means for entry only in cases of emergency and to be used only by a select group of Administration, Police, and Committee members.

Chris and Steve will work on the status of door locks, alarms and cameras to confirm if working or not.

Other:

Routine Cleaning at the Texier House Museum: The Texier House was cleaned in early July. Vander Fliet had mentioned that he had correspondence and agreement with Bill Hance that the Texier House will be cleaned every two months going forward.

The Mayor stated that the committee should put together a list of possible financial “asks” related to requests for financial help from the County. Possibly Public Works also might be able to assist, as needed, e.g., with the cabinetry throughout the museum.

The Mayor knows of the increasingly fragile current state of the mural and believes that a home has been found for the mural.

Artifact Assessment Program

The committee awaits the summary from the State regarding Artifact Assessment program.

Scanning Day in August/September

The next Scanning Day will be on September 15th.

Photography Proposals

See attached. Taking photographs of 100 prioritized items would be an important starting point, for both insurance purposes, and as well providing the “next best” thing (for posterity purposes) should the original be lost or destroyed.

After some discussion, the Committee agreed that spending \$2,000 for taking 100 professional photographs was the right thing to do. A motion was made by Michael DeParto and seconded by Don Monetti to approve proposal submitted by Russ DeSantis. This request will be sent to the Council for approval. The Committee is working with the starting point of artifacts to be photographed, as initially suggested by Chris and Steve.

Scanning Proposal

There was interest in understanding the cost of scanning 4 or 8 boxes of documents professionally as an addition to the scanning already being done by the committee as the materials are being inventoried. Quantity, quality of scan, amount of time to scan, etc. need to be considered.

UV “Solar” Shades Discussion

The committee discussed various options to mitigate harmful effects of the Sun on artifacts and pictures within the museum. Suggestions of an increased use of existing wooden shades, and/or possibly an increased use of protective materials either on the windows or on the artifacts themselves (at least on pictures, photographs, etc., depending on the situation). There are various degrees of shading that can be purchased for the windows or artifacts. 36” x 15’ sheets can be purchased, either online or through Home Depot. It was commented that artifacts, pictures on the Southwestern side of the building are more vulnerable.

Gods Acres Sign

Chris with help from Steve is looking at final changes to the Gods Acres Sign. These suggested changes are being provided to Councilwoman Christine Ead.

Trivia for Watchung Sign

Mike is working on new trivia questions for the digital sign outside of Borough Hall.

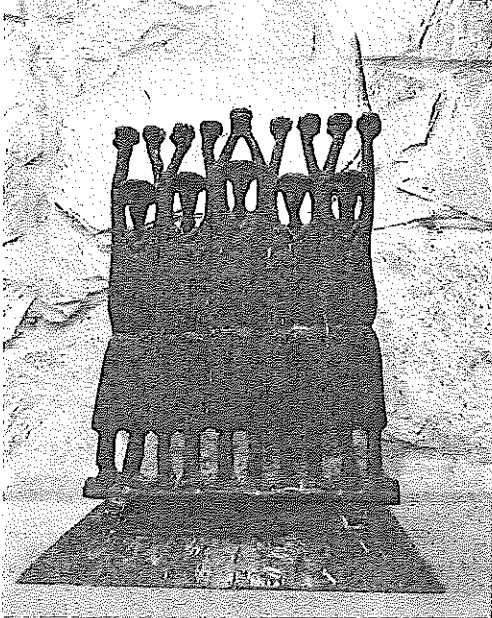

Job Description

Estimate is for photos of up to 100 historical items for the Watchung Historical Committee at the Texier House Museum. The photographer will use professional lighting and backdrops on location. Logistics are still to be worked out but best would be if similar sized pieces could be photographed in succession to avoid continually having to change the lighting setups.

Any items over 100 will be billed at \$20 per item.

Afterward the photos will be processed and a password-protected photo gallery will be created from which high-resolution images can be downloaded.

Fee: \$2,000

The proposal should include/consider the following:

1. Brief overview of qualifications/past work of the photographer <- Russ has 4websites with examples

What do we mean of qualifications? certainly not degrees. How about reviews/recommendations?

- 2. Required number of photographs = 100 photos
- 3. Resolution of photographs that will be provided. 600 DPI the absolute minimum, greater resolution is recommended and preferred. <- I think that we are telling a professional how to do her/his job. Do we want to specify what camera to use? What format the photos should be TIFF, JPG, PNG. I think we should rely on their judgement.
- 4. Final deliverable format: jpg for all photographs, shared with the Committee (payment will not be provided until all services are complete). Again I am not sure JPG is the right format. I think we should rely on your judgment.
- 5. The photographer should consider how to prevent glare for those items or photos which may be contained within a plastic or glass frame/case.
- 6. Work to be completed before the end of the year, mid November the latest is preferred. OK
- 7. See attached PDF for a list of items that are to be photographed. Those items noted "YES" under the "photo for web or insurance" are items required to be photographed. Additional information is provided in the Notes segment for select artifacts/photos. <-I have already shared the list. Againwe need Steve and others to review the list and evaluate the priority of items as well as add/delete.

Reasons for Photography

1. Photographs for the Web
2. Insurance (no need for high quality, but if we are getting photos for the web, the photos can also be used for insurance.
3. Track Condition/Damage over time.
4. Preserve the Original – Show the Copy (if there was a concern).

Insurance (Summary of Discussion with Jim D.)

1. Insurance coverage for the Museum, but insurance we are eligible for is limited to what we can show as to what is lost. Property & Casualty Insurance (Aggregate value for other buildings that are insured in the Borough).
2. We have partial compensation for artifacts that we can show were in the museum, but we will most likely get less than the true value (unless it is appraised).
3. Coverage on Artifacts:
 - a. Need appraisals for items we want a rider for. Items have no value unless it is appraised.
 - b. Most items, however, are not replaceable. Photography preserves the artifacts (for example, we cannot replace the ration books).
 - c. The Legend of Watchung Mural is an example where the Borough has a rider on its insurance because the mural was appraised.
 - d. Need a rider on all artifacts which is very time consuming.
4. Borough Recommendations:
 - a. Fireproof case for most important artifacts.
 - b. UV Blinds top protect artifacts from deterioration.
 - c. Photos of items are recommended and can be provided to the insurance company.
 - d. List most valuable pieces in the Museum (provide to the Borough)
 - e. Riders on the highest priority items (Parlin Diary as an example)
 - f. High quality not required for insurance purposes.

UV Shades (Summary of Discussion with Casey M.)

Two Options:

1. Solar Shades
 - a. Available @ Home Depot, Blinds-to-Go, Blinds.com
 - b. Available to filter UV rays @ 90, 97, and 99%.
 - c. Best for South & West facing windows but recommended on all.
2. UV Film on Windows
 - a. Moldable plastic
 - b. May stick to windows overtime.
 - c. Manufactured by 3M

Notes on UV:

1. UV Shades ultimately help to provide security and some fraction in reduction of heating/cooling costs.
2. Need to pick out a color, will replace the current shades.
3. Need to pick a transparency – ideally closed all the time, but can still see outside.
4. Don't need to pay for the high end for UV protection.
5. Texier Windows (9 Windows)
6. Back Door Window: (2 for backdoor)

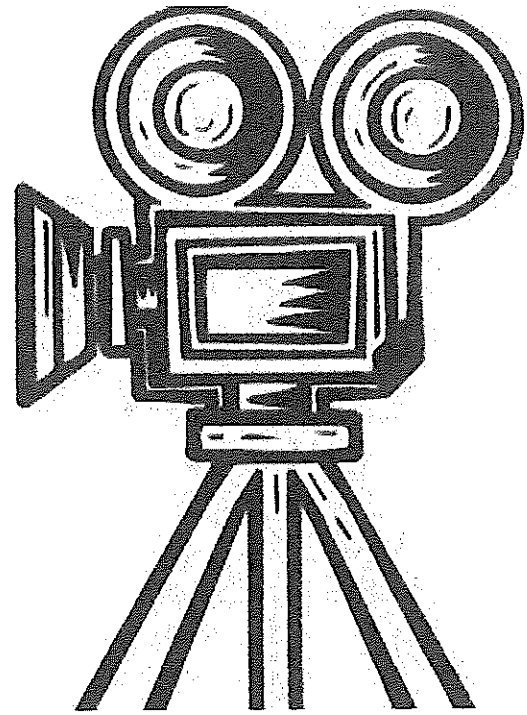
