#### COORDINATOR'S REPORT:

The Newsletter is expected to be going out by the end of March with the Borough events listed as well as the summer camp information. (See Attached)

Round Top Swim Club has been contacted and they are willing to work with us again this year for the Summer Camp program. D. Somerville and A. Burns agreed to run the program together as Director and Assistant Director. They will be contacting some of the staff that worked well in the past to offer them the positions available for camp counselor. The program will be available to accommodate 44 students weekly. Friday trips will be reestablished this year. Before and after care will also be offered again this year as this has been a great benefit to working parents. If inclement weather is predicted for an entire day we may take the students to a movie or bowling to break up the day.

The cost of the temporary restroom with ARF has increased from \$59.00 per month to \$153.70 per month as the borough had a contracted price and the contract expired. The increased amount is an average cost for the same service with similar companies after getting several quotes.

The I.D.E.A. Committee (Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Advancement) is planning an International Day of Families on Friday, May 13. This event will be held at Bayberry School in concert with the PTO Food Truck Friday. The Committee plans to have families volunteer to represent their country/culture at a table and give a brief lesson on language and provide a display, game and/or performance. There will be a "passport" given to the participants as a record for the day and the information learned. They are hoping for the support of the Recreation Commission for this event as well as the Juneteenth Celebration event scheduled for June 18th.

A tentative date of April 30th was scheduled for Little League's Opening Day.

- C. Zaikov reported there were three travel teams in Watchung this year,  $5^{th}$ ,  $6^{th}$  and  $8^{th}$  grade boys and Warren Township was running all other age groups. Also mentioned was that Youth Basketball was run at the high school this year including junior and senior boys with six teams of 8-10 students per team. C. Zaikov reported that the program was self-sufficient which included the cost of referees, uniforms and a scoreboard. T. Sims showed interest in running a girl's program next year.
