COORDINATOR'S REPORT October 19, 2022

Movie Night; The Movie Night held on September 9th at Phillip's Field was well attended with approximately 120 residents who came out for the event. The PBA partnered with Recreation by supplying (2) ice cream trucks for one hour prior to the movie with free soft serve ice cream for all residents. The event was scheduled from 7:00pm to 9:00pm. Since it wasn't dark enough until about 7:20 the movie started a little late and went on until 9:15pm. All prior movies have been animated and geared to a younger crowd but since the movie "The Greatest Showman" was a musical it was well received by all ages. Residents were offering to make donations to offset the cost since it was a free event. John Pennett put out a contribution can and we were able to collected \$40.00 in donations. MaryAnn Weber and John Pennett made the popcorn during the event and helped with the distribution of refreshments. The Mayor, Council, Police, Fire and Rescue Squad came out to support the event.

Fishing Derby; The Fishing Derby was held on September 17th from 9:00am to noon at Watchung Lake. Several students volunteered to help out at the event with bait and tackle from Mr. B's fishing camp. Mr. B supplied the borough with bait. Only 14 students registered in the Derby but with parents and grandparents that accompanied their children we had a good amount of fishing lines in the water for the event. Many of the fish caught were Sunnies or Blue Gil with a couple of Bass and one 23" Catfish which was the highlight of the event. Noah Baitel did a wonderful job keeping up with the flow of measuring the fish. Suz Stile along with Allison Baitel handled the registrations and the scoreboard. Council President Jubin gave out the trophies and Councilwomen Ead supported the event by taking pictures to share on our website.

Field Use; Mr. B's Fishing Camp was held at Best Lake from June to September. There were 117 students who were enrolled in the program. The Borough collected \$1755.00 for the field use with registration fees at \$15.00 per person.

Harvest Festival; The event is scheduled for October 22nd from 1:00pm to 4:00pm at Mobus Field. The event will include a Chili Cook Off contest as well as a Ribbon Cutting for the new playground. Since the playground has just been completed the grounds are not ideal for this event as the grassy areas have all been disturbed in many places. The DPW will do their best to cover areas that are compromised with hay and most of the festivities will be located on the tennis courts and black top.
