6. Will complete an evaluation of the HMP in conjunction with the MPC annually as needed, and a comprehensive update no less than every fifth year.

SECTION 6. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are improvements or purposes which the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements or purposes, and no part of the
cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
(b) The average period of usefulness of said improvements or purposes within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 40 years.

The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are improvements or purposes which the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements or purposes, and no part of the
cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
(b) The average period of usefulness of said improvements or purposes within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 40 years.
(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided for in this bond ordinance by $\$ 5,900,000$ and the said bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding $\$ 1,000,000$ for items of expense listed in and permitted under section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements hereinbefore described.

SECTION 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance. The bonds or notes shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of the bonds or notes and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 9. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. This Section 9 is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Borough's official intent to reimburse any expenditures toward the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof to be incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein in accordance with Treasury Regulations $\S 1.150-2$. All reimbursement allocations will occur not later than eighteen (18) months after the later of (i) the date the expenditure from a source other than any bonds or notes authorized herein is paid, or (ii) the date the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof is "placed in service" (within the meaning of Treasury Regulations $\S 1.150-2$ ) or abandoned, but in no event more than three (3) years after the expenditure is paid.

SECTION 10. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, of the interest on all bonds and notes issued under this bond ordinance.

SECTION 11. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough, which are authorized herein, and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and
beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough, which are authorized herein, and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 12. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication hereof after final adoption and approval by the Mayor, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

## RESOLUTION REAPPROPRIATING $\$ 400,000$ EXCESS BOND PROCEEDS FROM BOND ORDINANCE NUMBER OR:01/10 TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LIBRARY BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Watchung, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey (the "City"), finally adopted Bond Ordinance Number OR:01/10 on April 26, 2001 (the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, following the effective date of the Ordinance, the City issued bonds to fund certain improvements authorized therein; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has completed the improvements or purposes set forth in section 3(a) (i) of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that bond proceeds in the amount of $\$ 400,000$ (the "Excess Proceeds") are not necessary for the improvement described in Section 3(a)(i) of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with its statutory powers set forth in section 39 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq., the Borough Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to finance the cost of the construction and equipping of a Library by and for Borough (the "New Purpose"), thereby, avoiding the need to incur additional Borough debt to finance such capital needs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now desires to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to such New Purpose for which purposes bonds may be issued; and

NOW, therefor, be it resolved by the borough council of the BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Excess Proceeds of the Ordinance in the amount of $\$ 400,000$ are no longer necessary for the purposes for which they were authorized and issued.

SECTION 2. The $\$ 400,000$ in Excess Proceeds is hereby reappropriated; pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39, and shall be used to finance the cost of the construction and equipping of a Library by and for the Borough.

SECTION 3. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this resolution to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency, a resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital programs as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, shall be on file in the office of the Borough Clerk and will be available for public inspection.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
