



#### General Information

To rent a facility or field, community organizations are required to complete a rental application and pay the appropriate fee (if applicable). No "Sub-leasing" of any kind from one sports group to another is permitted. All dates, times and fields must be approved.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to consider all rental requests and allocate rental time based on the number of requests and overall time requested. The Recreation Commission reserves the right to disapprove permits if it is determined that fields are deteriorating because of overuse.

Community members must be 21 years of age to sign a Field Use agreement or rent a field or facility. All applicants are required to provide one adult chaperone for each group of 10 youth in attendance under the age of 21 for all planned activities.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to require the renter to provide police security for special programs.

All fees are to be paid in full two weeks prior to an approval unless other arrangements have been made with the Recreation Coordinator.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to cancel practices/games due to weather conditions and/or field conditions. Failure to abide by this policy can result in cancellation of your rental agreement.

#### Renter Responsibilities

All applicants requesting use of Watchung fields or facilities must observe the following guidelines and requirements:

1. The renter must leave the area, facility or equipment in a clean and orderly condition. Alktrash must be properly disposed.

 Prohibited Items: Beer, wine, alcoholic beverages, firearms, tobacco and filegal drugs.
 Liability: The Watchung Recreation Commission and the Borough of Watchung assume no liability for the renter's use of the equipment, field or facility. The applicant shall hold the Borough harmless from any claim or liability arising out of any activity or conduct of the renter while using the equipment Aleld or facility in question. Applicants are required to supply general liability insurance that covers the Borough with limits of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit with an aggregate of \$2,000,000.00. A certificate of insurance, must be filed with the Borough at least five days prior to the use of the Boroughs field or facility.

4. Governmental Boards and Agencies: facilities are available at no charge to official government boards and agencies for

events in the public interest when not otherwise in conflict with this policy.

5. Damages: Any and all damages to the facilities, equipment, and other Borough property, while being used by the renter, will be the responsibility of the renter and payable in full to the Borough of Watchung. Payment will include the costs of all labor, materials, and supplies to repair or replace the damage to facilities. The Recreation Commission reserves the right to decline renting to patrons who have incurred damages to Borguigh property in previous rentals.

6. Policy of Non-Discrimination: The Borough of Watchung facilities are available on a non-discriminatory basis. Appropriate activities need to accommodate individuals regardless of age, sex, race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disabilities, or marital status. The Borough of Watchung does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission, access,

treatment or employment in its programs or activities.

7. ADA Statement: Although specific programs for persons with disabilities are limited, the Watchung Recreation Commission is committed to providing equal access to programs and facilities for these individuals. Reasonable accommodation and support can be requested to provide access to desired programs and activities. Requests should be made at least 10 days in advance. In addition, where a need is demonstrated and resources are available every reasonable effort will be made to establish specific programs for persons with disabilities.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Watchung, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey (the "Local Unit"), has previously duly adopted or will be duly adopting various bond ordinances authorizing the issuance of bonds or notes to finance the costs of various capital improvements (the "Capital Improvement Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Local Unit desires to issue bonds to permanently finance the Local Unit Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Local Unit believes that there is volatility in the long-term bond market for municipalities resulting in the following problems: (1) increased and unpredictable interest rates causing interest rate risk and budgeting problems, (2) shrinking investor pools to purchase municipal bonds, and (3) a reduced number of bids at municipal bond sales; and

WHEREAS, the Local Unit has reviewed the Pooled Loan Financing Program proposed by The Somerset County Improvement Authority (the "SCIA"), whereby the Local Unit would issue bonds (collectively, the "Local Unit Bonds") through the Pooled Loan Financing Program of the SCIA; and

WHEREAS, the Local Unit believes that the SCIA's Pooled Loan Financing Program cures many of the problems of the volatile bond market by providing (1) a more predictable interest rate, whereby the Local Unit will benefit from reduced interest costs as a result of the "AAA" guaranty by the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey (the "County Guaranty") on the debt service of the SCIA Pooled Loan Financing Program, (2) market access to sell the Local Unit Bonds, (3) a certain investor pool to purchase the Local Unit Bonds, (4) a guaranteed purchaser of the Local Unit Bonds, and (5) decreased costs due to all the local units in the Pooled Loan Financing Program sharing in the costs of the SCIA Pooled Loan Financing Program; and



# BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT by and between the Borough of Watchung (hereinafter referred to as "Borough"), a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey and CGP&H LLC, 1249 South River Road, Suite 301, Cranbury, NJ 08512 (hereinafter referred to as "CGP&H"); and

**WHEREAS**, both the Borough and CGP&H desire to set forth the various duties, terms and responsibilities of the parties hereto;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby desires to approve of this Contract that was presented for the provision of said services.

WITNESSETH, that the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the mutual agreements herein contained, promise and agree as follows:

- 1. The term of the Agreement shall become effective as of the 12th day of August, 2022 for a period of twelve months (12), terminating at the close of business on the 11th day of August, 2023. The Agreement may be terminated by either party, by giving one (1) month advanced written notice to the other.
- 2. CGP&H shall furnish all equipment and materials and shall perform the services set forth in Schedule A. Scope of Services and Compensation.

  Compensation will be provided as in this Agreement and as awarded in accordance with Compensation Schedule in strict accordance with the contract as the word "contract" is hereinafter defined and in accordance with all other terms and provisions.
- 3. The "contract" shall consist of the following:
  - a. This Agreement and all Schedules annexed thereto.
  - b. Resolution of appointment made by the Mayor and Borough Council.
  - c. All other terms required by law to be inserted in this contract, whether actually inserted or not.
  - d. The Affirmative Action Requirements annexed hereto, applicable to this

contract, as Schedule B.

- 4. CGP&H hereby represents to the Borough that CGP&H is qualified to fulfill the position set forth herein with applicable requirements. CGP&H further represents that CGP&H is familiar with all applicable statutes, laws, regulations, procedures and requirements in connection with this appointment.
- 5. CGP&H hereby agrees to perform the services set forth under the Scope of Services and Compensation, Schedule A, for the Borough of Watchung during the period set forth herein above.
- 6. CGP&H shall not assign this contract or any of its rights or monies due hereunder without the previous written consent of the Borough of Watchung as evidenced by a duly adopted Resolution.
- 7. CGP&H represents that they currently have professional liability insurance in a minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate, and that they shall supply a certificate to the Borough showing said coverage. CGP&H further covenants and agrees to protect, keep and hold the Borough of Watchung harmless against any and all actions claims or demands for damages, which may be caused by the negligent error, act or omission of CGP&H or by the improper performance of the contract.
- 8. Payment to CGP&H shall be made in strict accordance with the terms of this contract. It is understood and agreed that in the event CGP&H is required to perform services that are not contemplated and are not within the subject matter of this contract and are extraordinary and are of a kind which would not ordinarily be performed in the normal course of providing services, that CGP&H shall be paid additional sums of money based upon change orders duly approved by Resolution of the Borough of Watchung Council.

- 1. Day-to-Day Administrative Agent Services: This includes creating and/or updating the Administrative Agent Operating Manual, and Affirmative Marketing Plan, if required. This also includes responding to general affordable housing inquiries, affirmative marketing, foreclosure prevention activities, and annual mailings to homeowners as well as preparing intent-to-sell packages and annual unit monitoring reports. It also includes advising Watchung on affordable housing requirements for new developments. GGP&H will strive to comply with all aspects of S2527 affirmative marketing legislation. Nowever, CGP&H cannot ensure that all other administrative agents administering affordable housing units in the municipality are meeting the regulations until further direction is provided by the State of New Jersey.
- 2. Administrative Agent Resale Fee: CGP&H will facilitate the resale of any affordable sales unit that is put up for sale by its current owner. The fees are all-inclusive of the services required to sell an affordable unit, including: certifying a buying household(s) as eligible, sending potential purchasers to the unit, facilitating an agreement between buyer and seller, and preparing and filing closing documents. The flat fee that is paid by Watchung will be billed once a notice of intent to sell is signed by the seller. In the event that the seller cancels the sale or should the unit not go to closing, this flat fee is still applicable and will not be returned or cancelled.

- 3. Existing Sale Units Waitlist Management: This service is ongoing and covers posting of the properties on our website, maintaining the waiting list, and updating the sites whenever needed. Waiting list will be periodically purged to keep it far more current than previously possible. It also includes all technology services for all of the above, including instant feedback to applicants.
- 4. Direct Costs: Cost of postage, printing of notices, copying costs, and advertising.

5. Additional Advisory Services as requested by the Borough: These include special projects outside the scope of general administration including, but not limited to trust fund monitoring, midpoint review, and CTM entry of trust fund or unit information, group home research to document creditworthiness, or other special projects such as extension of controls or implementing an affordability assistance program. CGP&H will not bill for any time under these services without written authorization from the Borough.

For all project set-up and project administration services related to affordability assistance programs, CGP&H will bill hourly at \$145 per hour for senior staff, and \$100 per hour for all other staff.

1. Affordability Assistance Program Services: This includes, but is not limited to, working with the Municipality's representatives to review and select affordability assistance programs and then prepare the Affordability Assistance manual which may include different affordability assistance programs. Once programs are selected and manuals written and approved, administration of these affordability assistance programs includes soliciting applications, distributing and processing applications, and income certifying applicants. CGP&H will review and approve applications and track the disbursement of funds for required reporting.

Accessory Apartment Program implementation: This includes, but is not limited to, the ongoing efforts to market the program to existing residents, distribute marketing materials, answer homeowner inquiries; take applications from initial submission through to case closing. - 1. Rental Fees: CGP&H will contact the next applicant on the waiting list to prescreen them for eligibility, refer them to the landlord, and invite them to submit a full application. CGP&H will collect and review documentation from the applicant households to determine their eligibility. Eligibility determination fees do not include credit or background checks, which are generally done by the landlord. The Developer/Landlord may pay rental certification fees.
- 2. Waiting List Management Fee: The waiting list management fee will allow us to maintain the waiting list on our web-based Affordable Homes New Jersey Profile (affordablehomesnewjersey.com). This unique online system provides around-the-clock, user-friendly and robust online tools for applicants, while also increasing our turnaround times. After initial lease-up, all applicants will be required to update their information annually.
- Lease Renewal Fee: CGP&H will advise the Developer of the maximum rental amount before each new lease is executed and we will review all executed leases and maintain copies in our files, as required by UHAC.

- 4. Ownership Fee: Resales: CGP&H will charge the seller a fee as a percent of the sales price to refer interested buyers, coordinate with both the seller and all interested applicants throughout the duration of the sale process, income certify prospective buyers, prepare the closing documents, attend closings whenever required, and perform other duties related to the closing. This fee is paid by the owner directly to CGP&H at closing.
- 5. Ownership Fee: Refinance Requests: CGP&H charges existing homeowners a fee per request to process requests for subordination or home equity loans. This fee will be paid by the homeowner requesting the review.

Milestone 2: Loan Closing: this includes comprehensive inspection of home to determine code violations, repair needs; developing a detailed cost estimate and work specifications for review and approval by homeowner; preparing bid documents for contractors to bid; review of bids received, preparing contractor contracts and homeowner agreements with the Municipality, and preconstruction meeting/contract signing/loan closing.
- B3. Milestone 3: Final Inspection: this includes working with contractors and homeowners throughout construction to finalize the rehabilitation work, troubleshooting any difficulties that arise, progress inspections, and case closeout.
- B4. Title Search Fee: Per property title search fee to confirm ownership and property liens.
- **B5.** Subordination Requests: includes the cost of processing of subsequent Program Mortgage Subordination Requests during the affordability control period. The homeowner will be charged a flat fee per request.

- 1. Failed Final Inspection: If a contractor requests a final inspection, and fails to meet the specifications of the Work Write-Up, the contractor will be charged a flat fee to partially cover the cost of having to conduct a second inspection and preparing the accompanying inspection reports. Charges for each failed final inspection will be issued directly from the contractor to CGP&H, as specified in the construction agreement. CGP&H will notify the Municipality if this penalty is ever levied against a contractor.
- 2. Unjustified Construction Delays: If the contractor delays construction without appropriate justification which requires CGP&H's additional follow-up with contractor, a weekly penalty will be charged to the contractor during the delay period. This will be specified in the construction agreement as a weekly penalty to the contractor paid directly to CGP&H in the penalty is imposed. CGP&H will notify the Municipality if this penalty is ever levied against a contractor.

# The following fees may apply to the Municipality only if the need arises:

On occasion, there are secondary or supplemental funding sources available to assist a unit get fully up to code in cases where the program's funding limits and the program participant's ability to provide their own funding is insufficient. To avoid abandoning the case since it cannot be brought up to code with available funding, we can partner with other funding sources in some cases to make the project work. CGP&H will bill hourly up to the limit per case (see right) for initial research to determine if partnering source is an option for the particular case, and if so, then coordination of same with secondary funding source. If more time beyond the limit per case is needed to finalize the partnering of funds to bring the unit up to code to obtain State credit for that unit, CGP&H will not continue without additional direct written authorization from the Municipality. #### **Exclusions:**

The following services are specifically excluded from the scope of services to be provided under this agreement:

- 1. All engineering and architectural services related to the rehabilitation of residential structures, and the coordination thereof. In the rare cases where such funding is needed, the homeowner is responsible for those costs.
- 2. All legal services as may be required to administer the program or resolve a dispute between a program participant and a contractor.
- 3. Direct costs such as advertising, reproduction, and expedited mail or messenger services more than amount identified above in this proposal.
- 4. Relocation assistance, in the extremely rare event that a household must be relocated during the construction phase.
- 5. CGP&H is not responsible for serving as the property manager of any rental units.
- 6. Lead based paint testing services.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation or sex.
- c. The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- d. The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with the regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to **N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq.** as amended and supplemented from time to time and the American with Disabilities Act.
- e. The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to employ minority and women workers consistent with the applicable county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C 17:-5.2. or a binding determination of the applicable county employment goals determined by the Division pursuant to N.J.A.C.17:27-5.2.

- f. The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.
- g. - i. The contractor shall submit to the public agency after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:

Employee Information Report Form AA302

j. The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Contract Compliance and EEO as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Contract Compliance and EEO for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C.17:27.





THIS <b>AGREEMENT</b> , made and entered into this day of, 2022, by and between the <b>County of Somerset</b> a public body politic of the State of New Jersey having its principal offices at 20 Grove Street, P.O. Box 3000, Somerville, New Jersey 08876 (hereinafter referred to as " <b>County</b> ") and the <b>Borough of Watchung</b> , a public body politic of the State of New Jersey, having its principal offices at 15 Mountain Boulevard, Watchung, New Jersey 07069 (hereinafter referred to as " <b>Municipality</b> ") collectively referred to herein as the "party" and/or "parties."
WITNESSETH
WHEREAS, the <b>County</b> 's Board of Chosen Commissioners created the Somerse County Office of Emergency Management (hereinafter referred to as "ØEM") pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-1 et seq.; and
WHEREAS, the <b>Municipality</b> is desirous of contracting with the <b>County</b> for the provision of OEM Services by the <b>County</b> via its Office of Emergency Management fo the time period of June 1, 2022 through and including May 31, 2025, and
WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement are authorized to enter into ar agreement for said services pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.
NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants agreements and other considerations between the parties, the parties do hereby mutually understand, promise, covenant and agree as follows:
<ol> <li>Upon request by the Municipality, the County will provide assistance with any of the following subjects once agreed upon by both parties and formally contracted via resolution:</li> </ol>
(a) Mitigation;
(b) NIMS Compliance (National Incident Management System);
(c) Emergency Operations Plan;
(d) Exercises;
(e) Local Emergency Planning Committee/Emergency Management Council Meetings;
<ul><li>(f) Incident Action Plans/Event Action Plans</li><li>(g) Mass Care Planning Assistance</li></ul>

2. The services requested by the **Municipality** listed in paragraph 1 hereof shall be performed by the **County** via its Office of Emergency Management.

- 3. The term of this Agreement shall be renewable annually, commencing on June 1, 2022 and terminating on May 31, 2025, unless terminated earlier as provided for hereinafter.
- 4. The **Municipality** agrees to pay the **County** for the provision of the above services and any additional assistance required by the **Municipality** at the rates shown below:

The above base costs shall be adjusted by an amount equal to the actual increase or decrease in the cost to the **County** to provide the aforementioned services. The **County** shall provide the **Municipality** with such cost adjustment no later than January 31 of each year that this Agreement covers. The amount paid pursuant to this Agreement shall be paid by the **Municipality** on a monthly basis, on the first day of each month following receipt of invoice from the **County** during the first year of this Agreement and in subsequent years increased/decreased pursuant to annual renewals.

- 5. In the event that the **Municipality** utilize the early termination procedures set forth in Paragraph 10, the **Municipality** shall pay the **County** any costs incurred by the **County** by its provision of services to the **Municipality** up to the date of the termination of this Agreement. The **Municipality** shall remit payment within thirty (30) days from its receipt of the **County**'s statement of such additional costs.
- 6. The County's OEM Coordinator or her representative shall attend the Municipality's Emergency Planning Council and Emergency Management Committee Meetings.
- 7. This Agreement may not be assigned by one party without the written consent of the other.
- 8. This Agreement is governed solely by the laws of the State of New Jersey. Should there be any issues that need to be legally adjudicated by a court of law, such proceedings can only take place in a court of law within the State of New Jersey. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Agreement shall be adjudged to be invalid a New Jersey Court of Law, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

- 9. The obligations of the **County** and the **Municipality** contained herein are subject to the availability of funds.
- 10. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon written notice by the party desiring to terminate this Agreement. Such notice shall be given no later than 120 days prior to January 1st of each year that this Agreement covers.
- 11. This Agreement and any amendments made hereto shall be subject to the formal approval by the **County**'s Board of Chosen Commissioners and the **Municipality**.
- 12. The **Municipality** and **County** agree and acknowledge, despite the existence of this Agreement between them, that they are individually responsible for all matters related to actions or inactions of their own designees, including, but not limited to, directors, officers, agents, employees, volunteers, and/or interns. The **County** is not and cannot be held responsible for actions performed, or lack thereof, by the **Municipality** or vice versa, consistent with and including the any and all applicable terms set forth herein whenever and wherever applicable.
- 13. The **Municipality** and **County** agree and acknowledge, despite the existence of this Agreement between them, that they are individually responsible for their own costs, including, but not limited to, costs of operating a government entity. The **County** is not and cannot be held responsible for the costs related to the **Municipality**'s operations or vice versa, consistent with and including any and all applicable terms set forth herein whenever and wherever applicable.
- 14. For purposes of this Agreement, the **County**'s OEM employees and representatives listed herein in paragraph 4, as well as their agents and designees, are employees of the **County** for matters related to pensions, tenure, workers' compensation and other related issues. The **County** is the primary employer of the individuals listed in paragraph 4, as well as their agents and designees, and all salaries and costs associated therewith are to be borne solely by the **County** pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-6(a) et seq.
- 15. During the period that the **County** provides services as set forth in this Agreement, should the **Municipality** receive any state and/or federal aid for health services contemplated herein, such aid(s) shall be paid to the **County**. Where said aid is related to programs in effect within the **Municipality** at the time of its availability, the **County** will credit said state aid towards the **Municipality**'s annual cost for same. The **County** shall retain all aids that are available for new programs and/or in excess of the costs as calculated based on the rates set forth in paragraph four (4) herein.
- 16. Any services requested by the **Municipality** of the **County** that are not specifically covered by this Agreement will be discussed separately and are subject to a separate agreement. If agreed to by the **County**, the **Municipality** will be billed on a contingency basis at a rate to be determined at the time of the request. The **County** or its designee and the **Municipality** or its designee shall meet as may be requested by either party and mutually agreed upon. Meetings will involve mutual problems and needs, objectives, methods of obtaining objectives, and evaluation of

accomplishments and adjustment and amendment of payments if necessary.

17. This Agreement contains the full and complete understanding of the Parties concerning this subject matter. Any and all previous understandings, verbal, written or otherwise, are null and void.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Watchung is obligated to provide affordable housing opportunities throughout the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough maintains an Affordable Housing Trust Fund to assist with the development of affordable housing developments in the Borough; and

WHEREAS, Our House, Inc., is a not-for-profit, charitable organization that operates group homes for individuals with developmental disabilities ("Our House"); and

WHEREAS, Our House owns the property identified as Lot 24 in Block 7004, located at 103 High Tor Drive, in the Borough of Watchung (tke "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Our House intends on operating a six (6) bedroom group home for adults with developmental disabilities on the Property; and

WHEREAS, Our House has requested a financial contribution from the Borough to make certain renovations to the Property in exchange for the placement of affordable housing restrictions on the Property to enable the Borough to obtain affordable housing credits therefrom; and

WHEREAS, the six (6) bedrooms shall then be rented to very low-income adults, defined by Uniform Housing Affordability Controls, N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1 et seq., as 30% of regional median income, with developmental disabilities, in accordance with New Jersey regulations or as may be otherwise approved by the New Jersey Superior Court; and

WHEREAS, in exchange for the requested financial contribution by the Borough, Our House agrees to the placement of an affordable housing deed restriction on the Property pursuant to the terms of the applicable affordable housing regulations or Court Order, and the Uniform Housing Affordability Controls ("UHAC") regulations, N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, Our House agrees to comply with all of the terms and requirements of COAH or comparable State department or agency, or by a Court of competent jurisdiction, and UHAC regulations in order to qualify all six (6) bedrooms of the Group Home as affordable housing rental units for supportive and special needs housing thereby permitting the Borough to receive credit for said units; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and Our House have negotiated and agreed to an Affordable Housing Agreement, which memorializes the terms and conditions of the Borough's financial contribution towards the affordable housing group home from its Affordable Housing Trust Fund, along with Our House's obligations in connection with same; and

This Affordable Housing Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of July 2022, by and between the parties hereto:

**OUR HOUSE, INC.**, a 501(c)(3), not-for-profit, charitable corporation organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey, having offices at 76 Floral Avenue, Murray Hill, New Jersey 07974 (hereinafter "Our House"); and

THE BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG, a New Jersey municipal corporation in the County of Somerset, with an address at 15 Mountain Boulevard. Watchung, New Jersey 07069 (hereinafter the "Borough").

### **RECITALS:**

WHEREAS, Our House owns the property identified as Let 24 in Block 7004 on the official tax map of the Borough of Watchung, consisting of approximately 1.50± acres, located at 103 High Tor Drive (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Our House intends on operating a six (6) bedroom group home for adults with developmental disabilities on the Property; and

WHEREAS, Our House has requested a financial contribution from the Borough to make certain renovations to the Property in exchange for the placement of affordable housing restrictions on the Property to enable the Borough to obtain affordable housing credits therefrom; and

WHEREAS, the group home shall be an approximately 2,086 sq. ft. ranch-style residence, consisting of six (6) bedrooms, three (3) full bathrooms, a kitchen, a living room, a family room, and a staff office room (the "Group Home"), and

**WHEREAS**, the Group Home, by and through the operation of Our House, shall provide residential, vocational, educational, recreational and support services to low income adults with developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Group Home shall not be age-restricted, nor be occupied by individuals under eighteen (18) years of age; and

WHEREAS, Our House shall hold and maintain a license to operate the Group Home for the developmentally disabled from the Department of Human Services of the State of New Jersey ("DHS") Division of Development Disabilities ("DDD"), the Department of Children and Families of the State of New Jersey ("DCF"), or comparable State department or agency; and

WHEREAS, the six (6) bedrooms shall then be rented to very low-income adults, defined by Uniform Housing Affordability Controls, N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1 et seq., as 30% of regional median income, with developmental disabilities, in accordance with New Jersey regulations or as may be otherwise approved by the New Jersey Superior Court; and

WHEREAS, in exchange for the requested financial contribution by the Borough, Our House agrees to the placement of an affordable housing deed restriction on the Property pursuant to the terms of the applicable affordable housing regulations or Court Order, and the Uniform Housing Affordability Controls ("UHAC") regulations, N.J.A.C. 5:80-261, et sea; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the form deed restriction to be placed on the Property prepared by the Borough Attorney pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, following the form of Appendix E-2 of the UHAC regulations, is attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof (the "Deed Restriction"); and

WHEREAS, the Group Home shall qualify as 'supportive and special needs housing" as defined in New Jersey regulations, and accepted as affordable housing by COAH or comparable State department or agency, or by a Court of competent jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Our House further agrees to comply with all of the terms and requirements of COAH or comparable State department or agency, or by a Court of competent jurisdiction, and UHAC regulations in order to qualify all six (6) bedrooms of the Group Home as affordable housing rental units for supportive and special needs housing thereby permitting the Borough to receive credit for said units; and

WHEREAS, further, pursuant to prior COAH Regulations, and approval by COAH or comparable State department or agency, or by a Court of competent jurisdiction, for the units to qualify as affordable housing units in order for the Borough to receive credit, the bedrooms shall comply with applicable law and UHAC regulations, with the exception of the standard UHAC affirmative marketing requirements for non-special needs housing; and Our house will work with the DDD in placing income qualified individuals in these Units; and

WHEREAS, Our House and the Borough wish to enter into an agreement providing for the financial contribution by the Borough for the renovation and operation of the Group Home, in exchange for the establishment and preservation of affordability controls and deed restrictions on the Property for the Group Home.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the foregoing, and in consideration of the mutual covenants, agreements, conditions, understandings and undertakings hereinafter contained and set forth, the parties hereto, and for their successor and assigns, hereby agree as follows:

### ARTICLE I

### **DEFINITIONS**

Section 1.1. <u>Definitions</u>. Certain terms used in this Agreement are defined in this Section and/or other portions of this Agreement by reference to other documents. Each term defined shall have the meaning given it unless the context clearly indicates otherwise. The following terms are defined in this Section:

- 1. "Administrative agent" shall be the entity responsible for administering the affordability controls for the Borough pursuant to UHAC regulations;
- 2. "Affordable Housing Credit" shall have the meaning set forth in Section 3.2(c) of this Agreement, with one unit of credit for each pedroom;
- 3. "Affordable Housing Credit Loss Event" shall have the meaning set forth in Section 3.3 of this Agreement;
- 4. "Event of Default" shall have the meaning set forth in Section 5.1 of this Agreement;
- 5. "Forced Delay" shall mean delay or delays due to: governmental action, or lack thereof, beyond the reasonable and customary period of time expectation for governmental action (for example, the issuance of a building permit); shortages or unavailability of materials; labor disputes (including, but not limited to, strikes, slow-downs, job actions, picketing and/or secondary boycotts); fire, explosion or other casualty; delays in transportation; delays due to adverse weather conditions; acts of God; directives or requests by any governmental entity, authority, agency or department; any court or administrative orders or regulations; adjustments of insurance; acts of declared or undeclared war, warlike conditions in this or any foreign country, acts of terrorism, public disorder, riot or civil commotion; or by anything else beyond the reasonable control of Our House, or its agents, employees or contractors.
- 6. "Hazardous Substances" shall mean any pollutants, contaminants, or industrial, toxic, hazardous, or extremely hazardous chemicals, wastes, materials or substances which are defined, determined, classified or identified as such in any Hazardous Substances Law, including, without limitation: oil, petroleum, petroleum by-products, friable asbestos, polychlorinated biphenyls, and urea formaldehyde;

- 7. "Hazardous Substances Law" shall mean all applicable statutes, laws, acts, ordinances, rules, regulations, orders, decrees, and rulings of any federal, New Jersey and/or local governmental or quasi-governmental body, agency, board, commission and/or court relating to the protection of health and/or the environment or otherwise regulating and/or restricting the use, storage, disposal, treatment, handling, release and/or transportation of Hazardous Substances including, without limitation, The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980, as now or hereafter amended, The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, as now or hereafter amended, and the Environmental Control Laws of the State of New Jersey as now or hereafter amended, and all regulations respectively promulgated thereunder;
- 8. "Plans and Specifications" shall mean those plans and specifications which are approved by the Borough Engineer, Borough Construction Official, or other Borough approving authority.
- 9. "Group Home" shall mean the group home for adults with developmental disabilities, with not less than six (6) bedrooms, to be maintained on the Property.
- 10. "Supportive and special needs housing" shall mean "group homes for people with developmental disabilities and mental illness as licensed and/or regulated by the New Jersey Department of Human Services.
- 11. "Unit" shall mean one of the six (6) individual very low income restricted affordable housing rental bedrooms at the Group Home which are subject to a minimum thirty (30) year affordable housing deed restriction.
- Section 1.2. Headings. The headings of this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not define or limit the provisions of this Agreement.

# ARTICLE II

### REPRESENTATIONS AND COVENANTS

- Section 2.1. Representations and Covenants of Our House. Our House represents and covenants that:
- (a) Our House is a duly organized not-for-profit, 501(c)(3) organization, and validly existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey, and doing business in the State of New Jersey;
- (b) To the best of its knowledge, Our House is not in violation of or in conflict with any applicable provisions of the laws of the State of New Jersey or any other agreement related to the Group Home which would impair its ability to carry out its obligations under this Agreement;
- (c) Our House is empowered to enter into the transactions contemplated by this Agreement;
- (d) Our House has duly authorized the execution, delivery, and performance of this Agreement;

- (e) Our House will do all things in its power required of it in order to maintain its existence, perform its obligations hereunder, and assure the assumption of its obligations hereunder by any successor body;
- (f) There is no litigation or proceeding pending, or to the knowledge of Our House threatened, against Our House, or any other person or entity affecting in any material manner whatsoever the right of Our House to execute this Agreement or to otherwise comply with its obligations contained in this Agreement;
- (g) When executed by duly authorized officers of Our House, this Agreement will be binding upon Our House and enforceable in accordance with its terms;
  - (h) Intentionally omitted;
- (i) Our House shall maintain control over the Group Horne, throughout and at the completion of renovations, and shall continue to, and permit and cooperate with the Borough's administrative agent to monitor the Units to ensure compliance with the affordability controls set forth herein, the Deed Restriction, UHAC regulations, and the DDD requirements;
- (j) The Group Home shall be licensed as required by the DDD, DCF or comparable agency one project construction is completed and certificates of occupancy for each dwelling is issued, and Our House or its designee covenants that it will maintain such license in good standing throughout the term of this Agreement, and throughout the term of the Deed Restriction for the Property, and Our House shall provide the Borough with a copy of any required License from DDD, DCF or comparable agency annually, upon receipt of same from the DDD, DCF or comparable agency;
- (k) The Group Home shall not be age-restricted, and shall not be restricted to youth under eighteen (18) years of age:
- (l) The Group Home shall be consistent with and meet the site suitability criteria of the State Development and Redevelopment Plan;
- (m) Our House or its designee agrees to work with the Borough and its administrative agent to comply with COAH or comparable State department or agency, or by a Court of competent jurisdiction, and UHAC regulations with the exception of the affirmative marketing requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.15, and the affordability average and bedroom distribution requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.3, unless otherwise agreed to herein; and
- (n) Our House or its designee agrees to annually provide the Borough and the Administrative agent a list of all current residents of the Group Home, along with all requested documentation and proofs required for the income verification and certification that such residents meet the very low-income requirement (30% of regional median income) to qualify as affordable housing, including a copy of all existing approvals, licenses and certifications provided by the DDD.
- Section 2.2. Representations and Covenants of the Borough. The Borough represents and covenants that: (a) it is empowered to enter into the transactions contemplated by this Agreement; (b) it has duly authorized the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement; (c) there is no litigation or proceeding pending, or to the knowledge of the Borough threatened, against the Borough or any other person affecting in any material manner whatsoever the right of the Borough to execute this Agreement or to otherwise comply with its obligations contained in

this Agreement; and (d) it will cooperate in responding to reasonable requests for the operation of the Group Home.

### **ARTICLE III**

# TERMS OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING CONTRIBUTION

### Section 3.1. Borough's Financial Contribution.

(a) The Borough agrees to provide a financial contribution in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand and 00/100 (\$250,000.00) Dollars to Our House. Such contribution shall be made within ten (10) business days upon receipt of the fully executed Affordable Housing Deed Restriction for the Property pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, subject to approval by the governing body of the Borough.

### Section 3.2. Conditions of Contribution.

- (a) Our House shall operate the Group Home—i.e. reptal of the six (6) very low-income restricted units—in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, the Borough's Affordable Housing Ordinances, the regulations, rules and/or orders issued by COAH or comparable State department or agency, or by a Court of competent jurisdiction, and the Uniform Housing Affordability Controls, N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1 et. seq., as may be amended from time to time, along with all other applicable rules and regulations, for credit as a six (6) unit, very low-income restricted affordable housing rental project. Our House agrees to rent the affordable units in strict accordance with same. Our House will work with the DDD to place income qualified individuals in these Units. All of the units shall be restricted as very low income rental units.
- (b) Our House shall have caused to be properly entered into the chain of title for the Property, and recorded with the Somerset County Clerk's office, a deed restriction applicable for each of the six (6) affordable housing units (bedrooms) at the Group Home, and putting into place thirty (30) years of affordability controls, restricting the affordable units by the filing of the Mandatory Deed Restriction for Rental Property as required by N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.11 and Appendix E-2, and approved by COAH in accordance with the UHAC Regulations. A copy of said Deed Restriction shall be provided to the Borough Attorney for review and approval prior to recording. Recording of the approved form of Deed Restriction by Our House shall expressly be considered a condition for the Borough's financial contribution to Our House.
- (c) Our House shall provide proof of recording of the COAH deed restriction for the Group Home to the Borough Attorney by providing a copy of the deed restriction with the "recorded" stamp of the Somerset County Clerk. The documents which create the COAH deed restrictions on the units shall contain the following provision:

"Sale and use of the property is governed by regulations known as the Uniform Housing Affordability Controls, which are found in New Jersey Administrative Code at Title 5, chapter 80, subchapter 26 (N.J.A.C. 5:50-26.1, et seq., the "Regulations") and any amendments, changes or supplements thereto. Consistent with the Regulations, the following covenants (the "Covenants") shall run with the land for the period of time commencing upon the earlier of (a) the date hereof, or (b) the prior commencement of the "Control Period", as that term is defined in the Regulations, and terminating upon the expiration of the Control Period as provided in the Regulations.

In accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.5, each restricted unit shall remain subject to the affordability controls set forth therein during the Control Period until the municipality in which the unit is located elects to release the unit from such requirements. Prior to such a municipal election, a restricted unit must remain subject to the affordability controls for a period of at least thirty (30) years."

- (d) Our House shall have provided the Borough with a copy of good standing certificate.
- (e) The Group Home shall be in compliance with all Hazardous Substance Laws and, to the extent applicable, the Group Home shall have received all necessary governmental approvals for any Hazardous Substances remediation plan required in connection with the renovation and maintenance of the Group Home.
- (f) Our House shall be the owner and operator of the Group Home at all times during the term of the affordable housing restriction period for the Property. Any sale of the Property or transfer of operation of the Group Home to any other entity or other use not specifically for the provision of residential, vocational, educational, recreational and support services to low income adults with developmental disabilities shall require prior written approval by the Borough, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed, provided that any such assignee shall agree to assume all obligations of Our House pursuant to this Agreement and that any such assignment shall be in accordance with the requirements of any applicable legal requirements, including, but not limited to, any applicable requirements of COAH, the DDD, and/or DCF, which may be now or hereinafter be in effect with respect to the ownership and operation of the Group Home.

#### ARTICLE IV

### REGULATORY TERMS AND CONDITIONS

<u>Section 4.1.</u> <u>Limitation on the Borough's Obligation.</u> The Borough shall not be liable under this Agreement to Our House or any other party for the completion of, or failure to complete, any activities which are part of the construction or renovation of the Group Home.

Section 4.2. Equal Opportunity. During the construction/renovation of the Group Home, Our House shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, martial status, condition of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) or AIDS-related complex, national origin or ancestry in the hiring, firing, promoting, or demoting, of any person engaged in the construction work.

Section 4.3 Maintenance of the Group Home. Our House or its designee shall maintain the Group Home in good condition and in compliance with all applicable health, safety, building, fire, zoning, subdivision, and environmental laws, regulations, codes and ordinances, in a manner consistent with group homes providing Supportive and special needs housing of similar age and size in Somerset County, New Jersey.

### ARTICLE V

### DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

Section 5.1. Events of Default. Each of the Tollowing shall constitute an "Event of Default" hereunder:

- (a) Failure of Our House to materially comply with terms, provisions, or conditions of this Agreement and failure to cure the same subject to Forced Delays, within thirty (30) days of receipt of written notice by the Borough specifying such failure (or if such failure to perform cannot be cured within thirty (30) days, failure to commence cure within thirty (30) days after receipt of such notice and thereafter diligently pursue such cure within one hundred twenty (120) days after receipt of such notice);
- (b) Failure of Our House to utilize the Group Home and the Property in a manner to qualify as affordable housing units as set forth herein;
- (c) The filing of any voluntary petition in bankruptcy court or otherwise seeking relief from creditors by or against Our House;
- (d) Our House shall make an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or shall submit in writing is inability to pay its debts generally as they become due;
- (e) Our House consents to, or acquiesces in, the appointment of a receiver, liquidator, or trustee of itself or of the whole or any substantial part of its properties or assets or a court of competent jurisdiction enters an order, judgment or decree appointing a receiver, liquidator or trustee of Our House, or of the whole or any substantial part of the property or assets of Our House, and such order, judgment or decree shall remain unvacated or not set aside or unstayed for one hundred twenty (120) days;

- (f) Material misrepresentation or material misstatement of fact when made in any written document and/or written agreement by Our House or any of its officers or representatives to the Borough.
- (g) Sale or transfer of the Group Home or the Property by Our House without the prior written consent of the Borough in violation of the terms of this Agreement.
- (h) Failure of Our House or its designee to apply for any required licensure from the DHS, DDD or such other appropriate agency as per the terms of this Agreement.
- Section 5.2. Notices. Our House shall, with reasonable promptness, but in all events within ten (10) days after it has actual knowledge thereof, notify the Borough in writing of the occurrence of any act, event or condition which constitutes, or which after notice or lapse of time or both would constitute, an Event of Default. Such notification shall include a written statement of any remedial or curative actions, which Our House proposes to undertake to cure or remedy such default.
- Section 5.3. Remedies. Upon the occurrence and during the continuance of an Event of Default under this Agreement, but only after all cure provisions have been exhausted, the Borough shall have the right to take any or all of the following actions against Our House or any affiliated entities:
  - (a) Institute appropriate proceedings to specifically enforce performance hereof; and
- (b) Institute proceedings to have the refund of the financial contribution made by the Borough.
- Section 5.4. Attorney's Fees and Costs. Our House agrees to pay or cause to be paid, promptly upon demand by the Borough, reasonable attorney's fees actually incurred and all reasonable costs and expenses actually incurred in connection with such enforcement or exercise of remedies of the Borough hereunder.
- Section 5.5. Right to Cure Defaults. The Borough shall give written notice of each default of which it has knowledge to Our House. Except as otherwise provided herein, Our House shall have the right to cure any default existing under this Agreement within ninety (90) days of the receipt of notice of default from the Borough.

### ARTICLE VI

### **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

Section 6.1. Agreement Term. The term of this Agreement shall commence upon the date this Agreement has been fully executed by all parties hereto and the terms, restrictions and

covenants of this Agreement shall terminate upon thirty (30) years from the commencement of this Agreement, unless extended by amendment of this Agreement by the Parties hereto.

Section 6.2. Hold the Borough Harmless from Claims; Insurance. Our House hereby agrees to defend and hold the Borough, its officials, appointees, employees and contractors, harmless from and against any and all claims, actions, damages, liability and expense, including reasonable attorney's fees, in connection with any loss of life, personal injury, damage to property, breach of contract or any other claims, actions, or damages arising from or out of the construction, renovation or operation of the Group Home by Our House other than and to the extent caused by the willful actions or omissions or recklessness or negligence of the Borough.

Our House shall carry and maintain general liability insurance for bodily injury in the amount not less than one million (\$1,000,000) dollars per occurrence, and liability insurance for property damage in the amount not less than one million (\$1,000,000) dollars per occurrence, with excess umbrella liability coverage of not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars, for the duration of this Agreement, and throughout the duration of the Deed Restriction for the Property. The insurance policies shall provide the Borough as an additional insured, and the policy shall further provide that the Borough will be notified at least thirty (30) days in advance of cancellation or material change in the policy.

Section 6.3. Notices. All notices given in connection herewith shall be deemed effective upon receipt (as evidenced by the U.S. Mail return receipt or commercial delivery service receipt) or refusal to accept delivery, and shall be given by personal delivery, express overnight delivery service, or placed in the U.S. Mail, registered, with return receipt requested, and postage prepaid. - Section 6.4. Entire Agreement. In the event that any one or more provisions contained in this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect by a final, non-appealable decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not invalidate or otherwise affect any other provision of this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be construed as if such an invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein, provided such Severability does not materially affect the basic understanding of the parties as reflected in this Agreement.
- Section 6.6. Counterparts. This Agreement and any amendments hereto may be executed by the parties hereto in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- Section 6.7. Further Assurances. The parties herete shall cooperate and take such action, give assurances and execute and deliver such documents as may be reasonably required by the other party in order to effectuate the intent, purposes and provisions of this Agreement and to confirm to third parties the existence and good standing of this Agreement.
- Section 6.8. Successors This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of Our House and the Borough and their respective successors and assigns.
- Section 6.10. The Borough Not a Joint Venturer. The Borough, by making this Agreement or by any action pursuant hereto, will not be deemed a partner or joint venturer with Our House, and Our House and the Borough each agree to hold the other harmless for any damages and expenses resulting from such a construction of the relationship of the parties or any assertion thereto.
- Section 6.11. Applicable Law. All actions and documents in connection with this Agreement shall be governed by and construed in conformity with the laws of the State of New Jersey. The parties hereto consent to be sued in New Jersey Superior Court-Somerset County in any action to enforce the provisions of this Agreement.
- Section 6.12. <u>Modification and Assignment.</u> The terms of this Agreement may not be waived, modified, or changed in any way by implication, correspondence, or otherwise unless such

waiver, modification, or change is made in the form of a written amendment to this Agreement signed by both parties. Our House shall not assign or transfer this Agreement to an unaffiliated entity, without written consent of the Borough, consent not to be unreasonably withheld, in accordance with the terms and conditions outlined in Section 3.4 hereof. Nothing in this Agreement, however, shall limit or prohibit Our House from assigning its operating obligations to an entity not a party hereto.

Section 6.13. Captions and Headings. The captions and headings contained in this Agreement are included herein for convenience of reference only and shall not be considered a part hereof and are not in any way intended to limit or enlarge the terms hereof.

Section 6.14. Waiver. A waiver by the Borough of any of the terms and conditions herein shall be in writing and shall not constitute a continuing waiver of said terms and conditions.

Section 6.15. Recording of Agreement. This Agreement may be recorded in the chain of title with the Somerset County Clerk for the Property simultaneously with the recording of the Affordable Housing Deed restriction.

ACKNOWLEDGING AUTOMATIC RENEWAL OF 2020-2022 URBAN COUNTY COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR PARTICATION IN SOMERSET COUNTY'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT AND HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS, Title I of Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended provides for substantial Federal funds being made available to certain urban counties for use therein; and

WHEREAS, this Act established certain criteria which must be met in order for a County to be the recipient of said funding; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Act, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has set forth requirements for counties wishing to requalify for entitlement status as urban counties and thereby receive CDBG and HOME funding during the FY 2023-2025 Qualification Period; and

WHEREAS, these requirements include the establishment of a Cooperation Agreement between Somerset County and units of general local government that wish to be joint members of the Somerset County, NJ Urban County; and

WHEREAS, the Shared Services and Consolidation Act, (NJSA 40A:65-1) provides a mechanism through which counties and municipalities may enter into such agreements for the provision of joint services.

It is therefore agreed by Somerset County, NJ (hereafter referred to as "the County") and Watchung Borough that:

## A. Terms and Conditions required by the Department of Housing and Urban Development

## 1. Applicable Programs

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish a legal mechanism through which the County government may apply for, receive and disburse Federal funds available to eligible urban counties under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, commonly known as Community Development Block Grant (hereafter "CDBG") funds, and, HOME Investment Partnership (hereafter "HOME") funds, and to take such actions in cooperation with the participating municipalities as may be necessary to participate in the benefits of these programs. Federal funds received by the County for these programs shall be used for the creation of affordable housing, barrier removal, sewer and street improvements, public facility upgrades, social services and other eligible activities. Nothing contained in this agreement shall deprive any municipality or other unit of local government of any powers of zoning, development control or other lawful authority which it presently possesses, nor shall any participant be deprived of any State or Federal aid to which it might be entitled in its own right, except as herein provided.

By authorizing and executing this agreement, the municipality understands that this agreement covers the CDBG and the HOME Programs.

## 2. Relation to State CDBG and HOME Programs

By executing this Cooperation Agreement, the included unit of general local government understands that it:

- (a) May not apply for grants from appropriations under the State CDBG Program for fiscal years during the period in which it participates in the urban county's CDBG program; and
- (b) May receive a formula allocation under the HOME Program only through the urban county. This does not preclude the urban county or a unit of general local government participating with the urban county from applying to the state for HOME funds, if the state allows.

### 3. Urban County Qualification Period

This agreement shall be effective for Federal Fiscal Years 2023, 2024, and 2025. The parties further agree that this Agreement will automatically be renewed for participation in successive three-year qualification periods, unless the County or the participating unit of general local government provides written notice that it elects not to participate in a new qualification period. A copy of that notice must be sent to the HUD Field Office. Prior to the date specified in HUD's urban county qualification notice for the next qualification period, the urban county will notify the participating unit of general local government by letter of its right not to participate. A copy of the county's notification will be sent to the Field Office by the date specified in the urban county qualification schedule.

## 4. Amendments to the Cooperation Agreement

The parties agree that each party must adopt any amendment to the Agreement incorporating changes necessary to meet the requirements for cooperation agreements set forth in an Urban County Qualification Notice applicable for a subsequent three-year urban county qualification period, and to submit such amendment to HUD as provided in the urban county qualification notice. Such failure to comply will void the automatic renewal for such qualification period. Said amendments must be executed by an official representative of each unit of the participating units of general local government and the urban county. Failure to comply will void the automatic renewal for such qualification period

### 5. Length of the Agreement

The agreement will remain in effect until the CDBG and HOME funds and program income received (with respect to activities carried out during the three-year qualification period and any successive qualification periods under agreements that provide for automatic renewals) are expended and the funded activities are completed. The County and participating unit of general local government cannot terminate or withdraw from the cooperation agreement while it remains in effect.

### 6. Certifications

- a) The county and the cooperating unit of general local government agree to cooperate to undertake, or assist in undertaking, community renewal and lower income housing assistance activities.
- b) The county and the cooperating unit of general local government are obligated, and they so agree, to take all actions necessary to assure compliance with the urban county's certification under section 104(b) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.
- c) The parties further agree that the grant will be conducted and administered in conformity with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the implementing regulations at 24 CFR part 1, and the Fair Housing Act, and the implementing regulations at 24 CFR part 100, and will affirmatively further fair housing.
- d) The parties are also obligated to comply with Section 109 of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, and the implementing regulations at 24 CFR part 6, which incorporates Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the implementing regulations at 24 CFR part 8, Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, and the implementing regulations at 28 CFR part 35, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and the implementing regulation at 24 CFR part 146, and Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968. The parties are also obligated to comply with other applicable laws.

### 7. Prohibitions

Urban County funding is prohibited from use for activities in, or in support of, any cooperating unit of general local government that does not affirmatively further fair housing within its own jurisdiction or that impedes the county's actions to comply with the county's fair housing certification.

### 8. Local Government Policies

The parties hereto also certify that they have adopted and are enforcing:

- (a) A policy prohibiting the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within their jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and
- (b) A policy of enforcing applicable State and local laws against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location which is the subject of such non-violent civil rights demonstrations within their jurisdictions.

### 9. Units of General Local Government as Recipients of CDBG or HOME funds

Pursuant to 24 CFR 570.501(b), the unit of general local government is subject to the same requirements applicable to the subrecipients, including the requirement for a written agreement as described in 24 CFR 570.503.

## 10. Grant Transfers

A unit of general local government may not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer all or any portion of such funds to another such metropolitan city, urban county, unit of general local government, or Indian tribe, or insular area that directly or indirectly receives CDBG funds in exchange for any other funds, credits or non-Federal considerations, but must use such funds for activities eligible under Title I of the Act.

# B. <u>Urban County Planning Process</u>

### 1. Establishment of Committees

### a) Community Development Block Grant Program

There is hereby established a cooperative Community Development Committee, consisting of two representatives from each participating municipality and two representatives of the County government, each to be appointed for one-year periods coinciding with the calendar year. The function of this committee is to set policy, to consider CDBG applications and to make decisions about how CDBG funds are allocated. The governing body and the chief executive (Mayor) of each participating unit of general local government shall make one appointment each. The voting procedure and meeting schedule of the Community Development Committee shall be governed by bylaws established and adopted by the Committee.

### b) HOME Investment Partnership Program

There is hereby established a HOME Committee, consisting of two County Commissioners, one representative each from the Department of Human Services and the County Board of Social Services, and at least three members of the community. The function of this committee is to set policy, to consider HOME applications and to make decisions about how HOME funds are allocated. The members will be recommended by the Community Development Office and the County Commissioner liaison and will be appointed by the Board of the County Commissioners. The voting procedure and meeting schedule of the HOME Committee shall be governed by bylaws established and adopted by the Committee.

### 2. Responsibilities of Committees

- a) The Committees shall evaluate and discuss the community development needs of the County, and shall recommend to the Board of County Commissioners annual programs for utilization of CDBG/HOME funds available to the County government. Towards that end, they shall be authorized to develop required plans, including a Citizen Participation Plan and such other documents, or certifications of compliance that may be required by the Federal or State government for the County's participation in the CDBG/HOME Programs.
- b) The Committees shall identify, in consultation with the County Community Development Office and local government and community agencies, priorities for the actual utilization of such funds as are made available from the Federal Government under this Title.

c) No CDBG project may be undertaken in any municipality without the knowledge of the governing body of the municipality, as provided in the Citizen Participation Plan. However, municipal approval of any application for CDBG/HOME funds shall not be a restriction on implementation of the County's approved Consolidated Plan during the period covered by this agreement. Be it therefor understood that no party to the agreement may obstruct the implementation of the approved Consolidated Plan by veto or other restriction.

# 3. Agreement as to Specific Activities (Interlocal Services Agreement)

### a) Activities

The municipality hereby agrees to cooperate with the County of Somerset in conducting activities eligible for CDBG/HOME assistance as specified in Federal CDBG/HOME Program regulations and approved for application for CDBG/HOME funds by its governing body. A current list of eligible activities is attached to this Agreement, but is subject to change by HUD. Specific activities will be set forth in the Annual Action Plan or Consolidated Plan submitted to HUD.

### b) Administrative Funding

The municipality also agrees to use by the County of certain of the funds to be applied for County planning and administrative costs, as specified in the annual Action Plan or Consolidated Plan submitted to HUD.

### C. Grant Administration

### 1. Responsibilities of Participants

### a) County

The municipality agrees that the County, as the applicant, takes full responsibility and assumes all obligations of an applicant under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and HOME Investment Partnership Act. This responsibility will also extend to parts of the planning and management process, including the analysis of needs, the setting of objectives, the development of community development plans and the Consolidated Plan, and all assurances and certifications of compliance with Federal and State laws. The County has final responsibility for approving CDBG and HOME activities and for submitting the Annual Action Plan and Consolidated Plan to HUD. This responsibility of the County shall apply to all CDBG and HOME assisted projects, whether or not the County or the municipality carries out directly an activity or activities included in the Annual Action Plan or Consolidated Plan.

## b) Participating unit of general local government

As appropriate, certain activities are to be undertaken by the participating municipalities, and specific Subgrantee Agreements between the County and municipality must be executed for these projects. Each municipality will be responsible for the implementation of these community development projects. The municipality further agrees to cooperate

with the County in complying with the requirements of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.

### 4. Severability

In the event that any portion of this Agreement shall be made inoperative by reason of judicial or administrative ruling, the remainder shall continue effect.

### 5. Supersession

This agreement shall supplement any previous agreements on this subject and shall replace and supersede any previously agreed upon provisions only to the extent of conflict of purpose.

### 6. Limitation

The execution of this Agreement by the County does not commit the County to the disbursement of any funds except those received from the Federal Government pursuant to Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.

### 7. Amount and Administration of Funds

The amount of Federal funds involved shall be the amount (s) applied for each year by the Board of County Commissioners pursuant to the recommendations of the Committee, subject to any modifications made by the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Any Federal funds received by letter of credit or otherwise shall be placed in a County Trust Fund established and maintained pursuant to the regulations promulgated by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs. This Fund shall be in a separate bank account subject to the control of the County Government which shall be the designated recipient of the funds provided by the Federal Act. Upon authorization by the County, and in compliance with State law and promulgated regulations, funds may be expended from this Trust Fund by the County or by payment to a Subgrantee pursuant to a Subgrantee Agreement. Neither the Committee, the County government, nor any participating municipality may expend or commit funds except as may be authorized pursuant to this Agreement and in full compliance with State and Federal laws and regulations. No participant under this Agreement may in any way be obligated to expend funds of its own except as may be mutually agreed in a lawful manner.

Be it therefore resolved that the undersigned parties agree to adhere to and comply with all the terms and conditions of this agreement.
