WATCHUNG RECREATION COORDINATOR'S REPORT January 8th, 2020

Field / Facility Use; WHRHS has requested the use of our tennis courts for the Boy's High School tennis team from March 9th through May 15th, 2020 Monday through Friday from 2:30pm – 5:00pm. Only 2 courts will be reserved to allow residents to use the additional court during that time.

US Sports has submitted an application for the use of Mobus Field for a youth soccer program for various dates in June, July and August of 2020. They have also put in a request to run two 8 week youth tennis program from March 19th to June 14, 2020 as well as two week long summer tennis camps.

Little League Opening Day is scheduled for April 18th.

Operating Budget;

An additional \$13,000 will be requested for the 2020 budget to cover the extra costs of the summer camp program. As the 2019 program required an additional \$13,500 above the original budget requested. I am anticipating that the enrollment may be higher in 2020 as this will be the 2nd year of the program at Round Top in Warren and there were good reviews by the staff and students. A higher enrollment will increase the costs for trips and supplies. Although the enrollment covers most of the cost of the program a set budget must be requested in anticipation of the projected cost of each line item. A total of \$35,000 will be requested for the camp operations and \$40,000 will be requested for the camp staff which also includes a portion of the Recreation Coordinator's salary. With all other budgeted items the total Recreation budget requested was \$111,000. an increase of \$13,040 from the 2019 budget.

Budgeted Funds Allocated for the 2019 Camp was \$30,000 for Camp Staff & \$20,000 for trips and supplies or \$50,000.00 total, a difference of \$12,948.77.

The Travel and Recreation Basketball Program; The enrollment fee was increased this year to help cover the cost of the referees and the custodial fees for the use of the schools when a custodian was not scheduled for another school program. Close to \$10,000 had been collected from registration fees for both Travel and Recreation basketball programs to date.

Custodial fees for the 2018/19 basketball programs came to a total of \$6187.50. Referee costs for the 2018/19 basketball programs came to a total of \$5320.00 Jersey Basketball Association for Travel Basketball was \$1050.00

Background Checks for coaches costs \$200.00

Supplies, Balls, Nets, Scoreboards, Jersey's etc. totaled \$5116.95

Watchung Hoops Website Fees \$300.00

Total program costs comes to approximately \$18,200. \$4500. has been added to the budget for each program or a total of \$9,000. and with the \$10,000. in registration fees the total cost would be covered the to run these programs.

A total of \$2660 was collected in field and facility use fees for 2019 and a total of \$7272. was donated to the Borough for events. With the Summer Camp registration fees collected in the amount of \$59,350. the Borough collected a total of \$78,652 in proceeds vs. the \$93,053 expended for Recreation's programs and events for 2019. Funds were also utilized from the trust account to cover costs of the referee reimbursements. The Borough was able to offer six (6) community events, a full time summer camp program with before and after care options, Travel and Recreation Basketball, a tennis program, a Women's Volleyball Program, and a Men's Basketball Program all for less than \$14,400 as a department of the Borough.
