## **COORDINATOR'S REPORT:**

The Borough has received several inquiries about the Summer Camp program. The program was approved by the Mayor and Council but we are still waiting for the guidelines from the CDC before we can implement a program.

The Spring Craft event in conjunction with Operation Pride, the town's cleanup day, has been approved and an online signup link has been added to the Borough's website. Three half hour time slots will be available to accommodate 20 children at one time with 10 available tables. Only 40 participants will be allowed to use the craft tables at one time limiting the area to 50 people at one time including volunteers, the CERT Team and commission members as stated in the executive order according to the Board of Health and OEM. Also the Environmental Commission will have tree saplings to give out during the event along with food trucks that will be supplied by the PTO. The Recreation commission will supply a spring craft for children 2 – 13 yrs. painting terracotta pots and planting flowers or seeds.

Juneteenth which is Saturday the 19<sup>th</sup> of June the school would like to have a celebration focused on culture with music and food trucks and again have the Recreation Commission supply some type of cultural art project for the children. They would like to include the Art Center for the music, the PTO to supply the Food Trucks and the school would supply a speaker. This program is still in the discussion stages.

The Recreation Commission will need to apply for the field use for the Music in the Park event. The band Lost in Place is not available on May 22<sup>nd</sup> as originally planned but they would like to have the event on June 5th instead. The Mayor and Council has approved the event for May 22<sup>nd</sup> so a date change approval has been submitted.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

The commission discussed the details of the Spring Craft Day. L. Monetti mentioned that two people from the Environmental Commission will staff a table with free tree saplings that will be given away with directions on how to plant them. T. Sims mentioned that the details of the Juneteenth event are still being planned and that she should have an update once more detail are available.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

The commission discussed the idea of having fireworks in town for the 4th of July. L. Monetti mentioned that the Rescue Squad has fireworks every year on the first Friday in December as part of the Tree lighting ceremony. F. Hayeck reported that the event was cancelled this year due to the pandemic but that he would talk to M. King from the Rescue Squad to discuss the possibility of holding firework on July 4th this year since it was not possible in December. D. E. Knegten suggested having a parade on July 4th and T. Simms mentioned extending an invitation to all town organizations to participate.
