FROM OUR MAYOR

Dear Residents:

This is my first Mayor's Message as your new Mayor, being sworn in January 1, 2011. I follow in the footsteps of Al Ellis, who officially retired December 31, 2010 after eight years of service as Mayor, preceded by another fifteen years of service as a Council member. Mayor Ellis was honored at year's end by Federal, State and local representatives for his many years of volunteerism for the betterment of Watchung and was a true and dedicated leader. The blizzard of December 26, 2010 set the stage for my entry into the Mayor's position and I must express my gratitude to our Public Works Department for their outstanding response during an extremely difficult winter.

A celebration with special personal meaning for me was the 100th Anniversary of the Watchung Chemical Engine Company this past year. Charter members of that original organization were from the Titus, Mobus, Blackadar, Greves and Aldrich families and over the years a total of more than 874,000 volunteer hours of fire protection were provided. Today, 100 years later, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of those same families remain on the rolls of the WCEC, along with a host of some of the finest volunteers to be found. A true tribute to the type of community Watchung has always been.

Watchung's finest, our Police Department, responded to a record number of calls in 2010 from our residents and those passing through Watchung, always doing the commendable job they do, providing safety and security. I would like to recognize the Watchung Rescue Squad for both the countless number of hours they dedicate to our Borough each year, and the way they are able - by a ten-count, a flick of a switch and the lighting of a fuse - to turn the Village Green into a Norman Rockwell winter wonderland. Much appreciation for the emergency coverage given, as well as the aesthetic transformation.

The Borough's finances are looking better than they did in 2010. As of this writing, we're not anticipating any layoffs or furlough days and it appears we will be able to adopt a budget within the state-mandated cap. February saw the implementation of a "Reverse 911" program. This program is partnered with Warren Township, who shared federal grant funding resources with us in order to include the Borough. If you are not already signed up, you can register online through the WPD website, www.watchungpd.com. The registration link is found at the top of the home page.

It has been brought to the Council's attention that many of you get a weekly advertising flyer packet or newspaper in your driveway. If you don't want this delivery and you're concerned about litter, please call 1-800-376-6222 to be removed and placed on a "Do Not Deliver" list.

2011 is the year the Planning Board will be finalizing the most recent Reexamination of the Master Plan. It's been in process for eight months and I want to compliment the Planning Board, Master Plan Committee and Board members, both previous and current, for their dedication. To those who serve on our Commissions, our Boards, our Committees and volunteer as Coaches, Scout Leaders, Library volunteers, etc., a resounding "thank you." To our Borough employees, who are a dedicated group of individuals, the finest I've ever been associated with - keep up the good work and professionalism.

Finally, it gives me great pleasure to serve as your Mayor. We have a very active and dedicated Council. I am both visible and available, so feel free to call Borough Hall should you wish to contact me for any reason at all.

Use biodegradable paper bags for all lawn debris and secure small branches and twigs in manageable bundles at your curbside. <u>*NO STUMPS WILL</u> <u>BE PICKED UP</u>. Trash or refuse will not be picked up and only small branches arranged in manageable bundles will be accepted. Your own contractor should remove large limbs/trees which have fallen outside of the Borough's Right-Of-Way. Remember, raking of leaves and debris into the gutter is strictly prohibited by ordinance and may result in the issuance of a summons.

HELP REOPEN OUR TENNIS COURTS!

Dear Resident:

The Watchung Recreation Commission is reaching out to the residents of the community in hopes of raising funds to resurface our Mobus Field tennis courts, located on Brookdale Road. In order to keep our taxes at bay with the rising costs of insurances, heating, air and salt, for the heavy snows this winter, the Borough has been forced to cut many budgets, including but not limited to, the recreation activities that our community has enjoyed over the years.

Unfortunately, the tennis court repairs and patches are now failing and the courts are in such bad repair that they are now closed until a new surface is constructed. A petition was turned in to the Borough Recreation Commission in April, 2010, signed by over 180 town residents, asking that the courts be repaired. A committee was formed in 2010 by residents to raise some funds for the court repairs, in hopes that the Borough would pay the balance. Unfortunately, it was not feasible for the Borough to allocate money for the amount that was estimated at that time; therefore, fund raising efforts were put on hold.

Once again we are addressing this issue. The Recreation Commission is asking our residents for a contribution of \$25.00 or more per household, hoping to raise enough funds to repair our courts before the beginning of the 2011 tennis season. REGISTER AND VOTE



The last day to register to vote in the June 7th Primary Election is May 17th.

If you are a Watchung Resident age 18 and over, a citizen of the United States, a resident of New Jersey for at least thirty (30) days prior to the election, and a resident of Somerset County for twenty-one (21) days, you may register to vote at Borough Hall, or print a form from the Borough's website at <u>www.watchungnj.com</u> and mail to Somerset County.

All voters are now eligible to vote by mail. This form is also available at Borough Hall or on our website.

RABIES CLINIC

The Warren Board of Health, in conjunction with the Middle-Brook Regional Health Commission, will be offering one rabies clinic this spring. All residents are encouraged to have their dog or cat vaccinated against rabies. Spring is upon us and we can expect to see a restart of activity in our local wildlife. Along with this activity comes the increased risk of exposure to rabies. If your pet has been previously vaccinated the health department recommends that your dog or cat be vaccinated every other year. If your pet has not been vaccinated against rabies, now is the time. The clinic is free to all. All dogs must be controlled on a leash and cats must be contained in a carrier.

PET LICENSING

Every year pet owners are required by local law to license their pets. In order for the license to be issued, the owner must present proof that a licensed veterinarian has vaccinated the pet against rabies and that the duration of immunity from that vaccination extends through at least ten months of the twelve-month licensing period.

The Health Commission has learned that pet owners seem to be declining and we want to tell you why it is important to license your furry friends. Licensing your pet allows local authorities to identify the animal and its owners if it happens to get loose. The license tag enables the quick and easy return of your loved animal. In addition, the license proves that the pet is appropriately vaccinated against rabies. If your pet happens to bite someone then its license tells local authorities that it is current on its rabies vaccine and the bite victim has less to worry about. Your license fees are used toward the provision of animal control services. A licensed animal control officer is available to provide professional services when an animal incident occurs. Finally, it's the law! Failure to license your pet may lead to enforcement action and penalties by the health department and/or police department. So, please license your pet by contacting the municipal building. It is one sign of a responsible pet owner.

DEER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Since 2003, the Borough has conducted a State-approved Community Based Deer Management Program in an effort to reduce the population of the existing deer herd in Watchung. Over the last eight years, the herd was reduced by approximately 880 deer, with a majority of the females culled carrying twins. Over the years of the program, vehicle/deer collisions have been reduced and a small semblance of return to the damaged undergrowth was seen. Due to economic downturns, the Borough chose not to fund a costbased management program in 2010/2011, but did permit a no-cost culling program to operate under a Borough management program, provided through the auspices of Warren Blue Ridge Sportsmen, a nonprofit sport hunting club with two million dollars in insurance, an outstanding safety record and a lengthy history. The 2010/2011 season was not a resounding success, due to various factors, such as the harsh winter, lack of sites and having to function within a short, existing sport-hunting season. We will be losing ground with our control efforts if we do not maintain what we have accomplished over the last eight years. In anticipation of a fall program, the Borough is again seeking the public's cooperation in providing cull sites acceptable to the rules and regulations the Borough has established.
